FORT BEND COUNTY HONORS CHILDREN AND RAISES AWARENESS DURING CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

On March 31, Judge KP George led a moving dedication ceremony on the historic courthouse lawn, recognizing the 2,075 children served by Child Advocates of Fort Bend in 2024.

In partnership with the Exchange Club, law enforcement, and community leaders, the event featured a field of 2,075 blue-ribboned white stakes and the official proclamation declaring April as Child Abuse Prevention Month—underscoring the County’s ongoing commitment to protecting its most vulnerable residents.

Fort Bend County Confirms First Case of Measles, Urges Vaccination and Vigilance

Fort Bend County Health & Human Services has confirmed the County's first-ever case of measles in an adult female with recent international travel. Judge KP George assured residents that public health officials are actively investigating the case and conducting contact tracing. "Your safety and well-being remain my top priority," said Judge George. Residents are urged to check immunization records, get vaccinated if needed, and remain alert for symptoms. The MMR vaccine remains the best defense against this highly contagious disease.

MEASLES

Measles is a highly contagious rash illness caused by a virus. Measles is usually thought of as a childhood disease, but people of any age can get it.

How is it spread?

Measles is spread from person-to-person by airborne droplets and direct contact with infected nose and throat secretions. The virus can remain contagious on surfaces for up to 2 hours. A person can spread measles for 4 days before and 4 days after the rash develops. Anyone with measles should not attend childcare, school, work, or other public places until they are no longer contagious.

Treatments

There is no specific treatment for measles. Care of patients with measles consists mainly of providing good nutrition and fluids. Antibiotics may be prescribed for treating eye or ear infections, and acetaminophen for fever.

Prevention

Measles can be prevented with a measles vaccine. 2 doses of measles vaccine are recommended for children starting at 12 to 15 months of age. The vaccine is given as part of the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine. A second dose of the measles vaccine can be given at any age, but at least 4 weeks after the first dose.

People who think they have measles should call their Primary Care Physician (PCP) or Local Health Department (LHD) for further guidance.

Symptoms

- Rash on the face and neck and then spreads
- High fever
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Cough
- Small red spots with blue and white centers inside the mouth

Symptoms may occur within 8 to 12 days after exposure. Rash develops within 7-18 days after exposure.

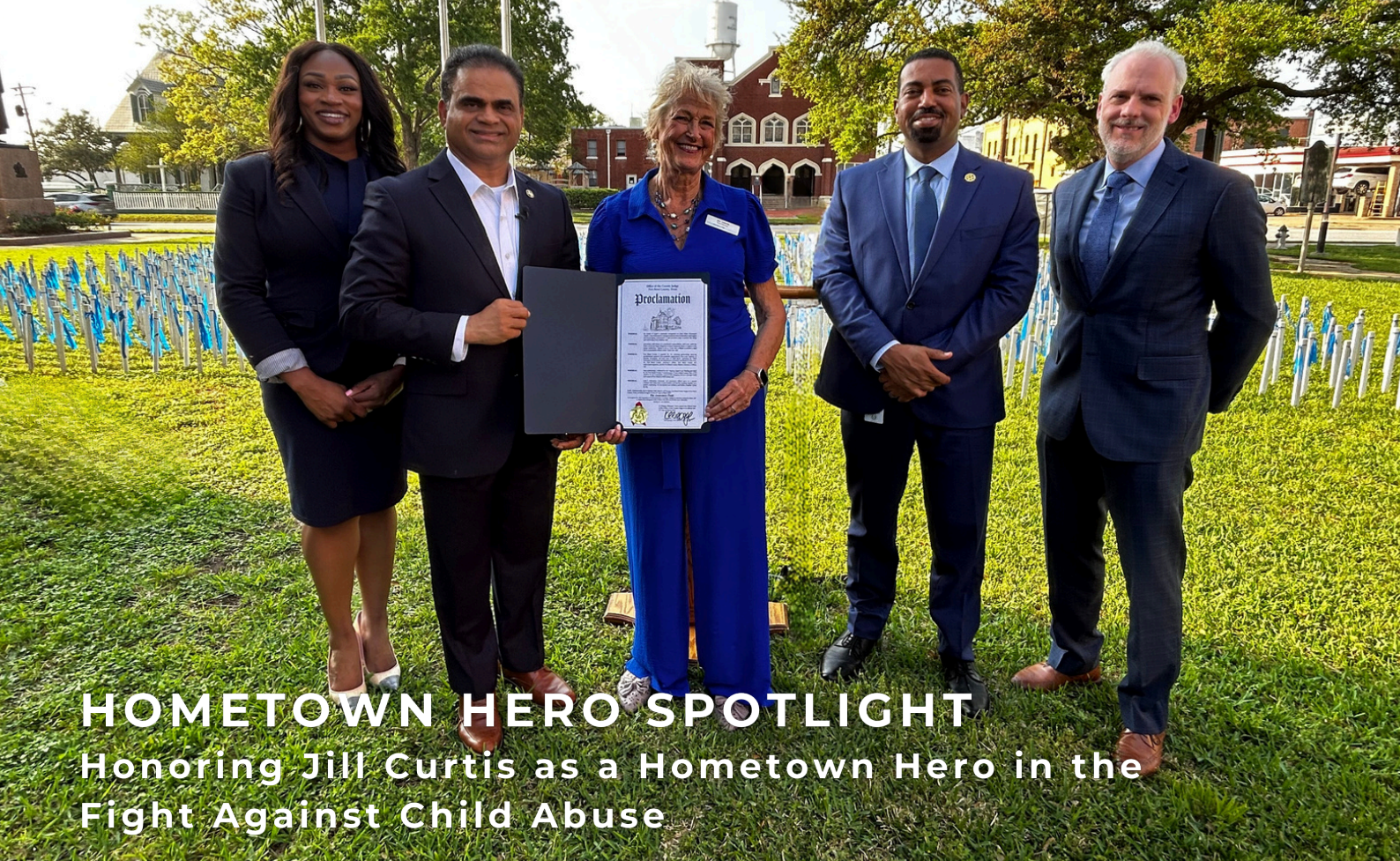


Fort Bend County Commissioners Court Recap – March 25, 2025

During the March 25, 2025, Fort Bend County Commissioners Court meeting, several key actions were unanimously approved, including scheduling a public hearing on community development, appointing a new interim purchasing agent, approving temporary road closures for mobility and street dedication projects, and enforcing no-parking zones along the Grand Parkway Toll Road. The Court also addressed important legislative matters, supporting and opposing various state bills impacting public health, food safety, and voter accessibility. Two workshops provided updates on constituent services and behavioral health initiatives. Additionally, the Court issued proclamations recognizing Harmony Public Schools' 25th anniversary and Fort Bend County EMS's deployment of its 100th unit in the Whole Blood Initiative, highlighting ongoing community impact and innovation.
